**BACKGROUND:**

The Seminole County Code, Section 20.38, Public Safety Fees, authorizes the Board of County Commissioners to establish fees to carry out the duties of the Department of Public Safety. From time to time the fees established under Section 20 of the Seminole County Administrative Code are evaluated to ensure fees align with the current cost of services, training and use of equipment and facilities provided by the Department of Public Safety and to recommend revisions as presented under this agenda item.

Staff recommends that the Board approve and authorize the Chairman to execute a Resolution revising Seminole County Administrative Code, Section 20.38, Public Safety Fees.

The Seminole County Administrative Code is hereby amended by the addition of a new Section 20.38, "Public Safety Fees", as more particularly described in the attachment.

**SECTION 20. FEE RESOLUTIONS**

**20.38 PUBLIC SAFETY FEES**

**A. PURPOSE.** To establish fees for services, training, and the use of equipment and facilities provided by the Public Safety Department.

**B. EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT – Review of Facility Emergency Management Plans**

Pursuant to Florida Statutes Chapter 252 the review of Facility Emergency Management Plans will be charged in accordance with the fee schedule established by the State Department of Community Affairs, Emergency Management Division under Florida Administrative Code Rule 9G-20. County Emergency Management Agencies may charge any amount less than or equal to, but no more than, the review fees established by Rule 9G-20.

**C. EMS/FIRE/RESCUE SERVICES – Wildland Fire Fees**

The Public Safety Department is authorized to seek reimbursement from the responsible party for costs incurred in response to a Wildland Fire, per FS 590.14. Any person who intentionally causes a wildfire, or permits any authorized fire to escape the boundaries of the authorization or to burn past the time of the authorization is liable for the payment of all reasonable costs and expenses incurred in suppressing the fire. The costs will include, but, not limited to, personnel, equipment, and materials for costs realized. The Public Safety Department will establish, and, maintain the following response fee schedule for these costs, which is consistent with current industry rates, and market analysis. Reimbursement will be collected when it is determined to be in the best interest of the Board of County Commissioners, is fiscally sound, reasonable, and appropriate.

## D. EMS/FIRE/RESCUE SERVICES – Training Center Fees

The Public Safety Department is authorized to collect fees when conducting or hosting training courses, classes, and programs as well as for the use of County training facilities, equipment, and instructors. Charges will include, but are not limited to: instructors, materials, equipment and facility usage, program development, and administration costs. Fees will be collected when it is determined to be in the best interest of the Board of County Commissioners, is fiscally sound, reasonable, and appropriate. Seminole County First Response Members will receive a 10% reduction of costs associated with all training activities performed at the Seminole County EMS Fire Training Center. The use of the Training Center is limited to educational/training activities. All uses of the Training Center shall require an EMS Fire Rescue Division Representative to maintain security, and, facilitate the use of the training center.

**E. EMS FIRE RESCUE SERVICES – Special Events**

The Public Safety Department is authorized to seek reimbursement from the responsible party for costs incurred in the performance of EMS, Fire, and Rescue standbys. The costs will include, but not limited to, personnel, equipment, and materials. The Public Safety Department will establish, and maintain a response fee schedule for these costs, which is consistent with current rates associated with personnel, equipment, and materials. There will be a mandatory 3 hour minimum charge for all off duty staffed events. Reimbursement will be collected when it is determined to be in the best interest of the Board of County Commissioners, is fiscally sound, reasonable, and appropriate.

**G. EMS FIRE RESCUE SERVICES – Fire Prevention / NFPA 1**

The Public Safety Department is authorized to seek reimbursement from the responsible party for costs incurred in providing fire prevention services. The authority to issue permit fees for conditions, operations, or materials hazardous to life or property pursuant to NFPA 1, Uniform Fire Code Section 1.12 The "Other Fire Prevention Fees" pertain to cost recovery that are not part of the construction permitting process and that the Fire Prevention Bureau is routinely called upon to provide. The Public Safety Department will establish, and, maintain a fee schedule for these fees, which is consistent with current industry standards, and market analysis. Reimbursement will be collected when it is determined to be in the best interest of the Board of County Commissioners, is fiscally sound, reasonable, and appropriate.

**H. EMS FIRE RESCUE SERVICES – Nuisance Alarms**

The Public Safety Department is authorized to seek reimbursement from the responsible party, or parties, for the response costs incurred from repeated alarms, and/or abusive uses of the 911 system. The Public Safety Department will establish,

and, maintain a response fee schedule, as below, which is consistent with current rates and standards. Response Fees will be pro-rated on ½ hour increments, invoiced and collected when it is determined to be in the best interest of the Board of County Commissioners, is fiscally sound, reasonable, and appropriate.

Nuisance Alarms are defined as any fire protection alarm activation in a commercial occupancy caused by mechanical failure, malfunction, improper installation, lack of proper maintenance or any alarm not caused by fire, smoke or heat which brings forth a response by the fire department. Alarm activations during reduced fire department response caused by severe weather shall not be classified as a nuisance alarm.

New System Installation - These provisions shall not apply to any newly installed Fire Alarm System for a period of forty-five days (45) from the date of installation.

Nuisance Alarm Fee - The following fee(s) shall be assessed for a fire department response to a nuisance alarm. A 365 day period starting from the first date of response shall be used to determine the total number of responses.

In the event the activation of a Fire Alarm System is deemed by the Enforcement Official to be a Nuisance Fire Alarm, the Owner shall be served with a Fire Alarm Activation Report by an officer or member of the fire department, indicating that the activation was deemed to be the result of a Nuisance Fire Alarm. This shall require the Owner to return a completed Report of Service/Repair within fifteen (15) days of receipt of the Fire Alarm Activation Report to verify, to the reasonable satisfaction of the Enforcement Official, that,

1. The Fire Alarm System has actually been examined by a Qualified Fire Alarm Technician per Florida Statute; and,
2. A bona fide attempt has been made to identify and correct any defect of design, installation or operation of the Fire Alarm System which was identifiable as the cause of the Nuisance Fire Alarm.

**Failure to return a Report of Service/Repair within said fifteen (15) day period, which is reasonably satisfactory to the Enforcement Official, shall result in assessment against the Owner of a Service Fee of for the Nuisance Fire Alarm.**
